NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1 Racing will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS). Any changes to the RRS are stated in this Notice and/or will appear in the Sailing Instructions, attached.
- 1.2 This Notice and the attached Sailing Instructions do not apply to Laser, 420, pram, etc. racing at WYC.

2. ADVERTISING

Advertising is restricted to *Category A*, except that *Category C* is permitted in the ADA Regatta and may be permitted in single-class regattas in accordance with class elections.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Racing is open to all boats of a WYC recognized fleet. Eligible boats must be entered by a WYC Family Member, and shall have a WYC Family Member or a WYC Annual Member on-board for each race. This changes RRS 46.
- 3.2 Notwithstanding the above, a boat may substitute a paid WYC Crew Member for the Family or Annual Member on-board up to 3 times per season. A paid WYC Crew Member may so substitute no more than 3 times per season on any/all boats. All substitutions must be reported to that fleet's Fleet Captain prior to substitution.

4. FEES

Entry, dock/mooring, crane use and fleet fees are as specified from time to time by the WYC Board and each Fleet. Payment of all applicable fees is required in order to be scored in races.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

The racing schedule is attached.

6. VENUE AND COURSES

The racing venues are various locations on Lake Minnetonka. The courses are described in the Sailing Instructions, attached.

7. SCORING, HAUL-OUT AND RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

Scoring will be by the low point system per RRS Appendix A. There are no haul-out restrictions.. Boats may monitor VHF Channel 68 before and during racing. The RC signal boat may (but is not obligated to) make OCS and change-of-course announcements on VHF channel 68 during racing. Boats may not make radio transmissions except in emergencies.

8. INSURANCE AND SAFETY

Each boat shall have adequate liability insurance and shall provide proof of insurance upon request by the WYC Board. Each boat shall have safety gear, proper government registration and shall display licenses and numbers as required by law.

9. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR BOATS

- 9.1. Each boat shall carry a current copy of the *Racing Rules of Sailing* or a facsimile with the same information.
- 9.2. Each boat using 150% or larger jibs shall have them equipped with visibility windows.
- 9.3. Each boat with an outboard engine shall either stow it aboard or keep it mounted on the stern with the shaft in the vertical position before, during and after racing while in the racing area.
- 9.4. RRS 77 and Appendix G are changed to delete that a boat must display a US Sailing-assigned sail number and/or national letters. Hull numbers and/or customary sail numbers are permitted. Other requirements of Appendix G are not changed.
- 9.5. A boat new to her class whose sail number duplicates an existing sail number in her class shall change the number on all sails so that there are no duplications.
- 9.6. A boat shall not race without her sail number on her mainsail, on her spinnaker and on 130% and larger jibs. Moreover, a boat using a borrowed or other sail not carrying the proper number shall report the discrepancy (never via radio) to the RC boat both before and after each race where the mis-numbered sail is used. Failure to meet these requirements is subject to disqualification by the RC without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

10. PHOTOGRAPHER'S RIGHTS

Participants give absolute right and permission for video footage or photographs of themselves or their boat, to club designated photographers, to be published in any media for press purposes and editorial or advertising purposes.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. **RULES.** Racing will be governed by the *RULES* as defined in the *RACING RULES OF SAILING* (RRS).
2. **NOTICES TO COMPETITORS & CHANGES TO THESE INSTRUCTIONS.**
 - 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board at WYC.
 - 2.2 Any Sailing Instruction change will be posted at least 2 hours before the race where it takes effect. A change to the race schedule will be posted at least 2 hours before the race that precedes a change in the schedule.
 - 2.3 The RC may alter these Sailing Instructions by hail after displaying code flag “L” with one sound in the racing area.
3. **SIGNALS MADE ASHORE.**
 - 3.1 When flag “AP” is displayed ashore, “one minute” is replaced with “not less than 45 minutes” in the race signal AP. Two sounds.
 - 3.2 Flag “AP” displayed ashore over flag “C” with two sounds means scheduled racing is cancelled and a Heavy Air Cup race will be sailed with a warning no earlier than 60 minutes after the signal. All boats start together using PHRF handicapping.
4. **SPECIAL SIGNALS MADE IN THE RACING AREA.**

Flag “AP” over “C” means the race is cancelled. Heavy Air Cup Race to be sailed as in Instruction 3.2. Warning no earlier than 5 minutes after the signal. One start, PHRF handicapping.
5. **SCHEDULE OF RACES.** The schedule of races is attached. Notwithstanding, a special Heavy Air Cup may be substituted for a scheduled race at the RC’s discretion.
6. **CLASS FLAGS.** MORC and PHRF boats shall display (9” square minimum) colored flags: (MORC I, Orange) (MORC II, Blue) (MORC III, Black) (PHRF I, Green) (PHRF II, Yellow) (PHRF III, White). Flags shall be displayed sufficiently to be seen by all competitors and by the RC. The RC may DSQ a boat without a hearing when a flag is not displayed per this Instruction. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.
7. **RACING AREAS.** The racing areas are as shown in **Illustration “A”**, attached.
8. **THE COURSES.**
 - 8.1 The course for each Class will be displayed on the start-line RC Boat. **Illustration “A”** shows Big Island and Commodore Cup courses. The Burton Cup course is similar to the Commodore Cup course except the start/finish line will be near MYC. **Illustration “B”** shows the layout and lists windward/leeward and triangle-based courses. **Illustration “C”** shows the layout and lists trapezoid-based courses.
 - 8.2 All marks are left to port in course racing except that a starboard-hand gate mark may be rounded to starboard after passing through a gate. The RC will designate at the start the side marks and islands are to be left in Commodore Cup, Burton Cup and Big Island racing.
 - 8.3 When a leeward gate and “S” Mark are not set in windward/leeward and triangle-based racing, all boats shall use Mark 3 (designated L2 in Illustration B) as the start mark and as the leeward mark In this event Mark 3 (aka L2) replaces the “S” and “Gate” in the course descriptions on Illustration B.

9. MARKS.

- 9.1 Marks will be red, orange, yellow or green spheres or tetrahedrons for triangle-based courses. Marks will be orange tetrahedrons on the right (RW and RL) and red spheres on the left (LW and LL) on trapezoid layouts. An offset mark may be set adjacent to a windward mark-- and is a mark of the course to be rounded to port after rounding the windward mark. When a mark is changed, the new mark may have different shape and/or color.
- 9.2 When a leeward gate is set, the RC will set an additional leeward mark, designated the **S Mark** in Illustration B, windward of the gate. Boats shall round the “S Mark” when the designated course requires rounding the S mark.
- 9.3 The RC may set windward finish lines at windward marks, or finish lines at a new mark set upwind of the windward mark. Windward marks are not marks of the course when sailing to a finish line set upwind of the windward mark.
- 9.4 Navigation buoys are marks of the course that designate obstructions and shall be passed on the side opposite the obstruction. “SLOW” buoys at channels are not marks of the course.

10. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS.

- 10.1 Navigation buoys designate obstructions, are marks of the course and shall be passed on the side opposite the obstruction.
- 10.2 A 4 boat length zone (circle) around the “**S**” **Mark** is a **Safety Zone** and is an **obstruction** for boats not then required to round the S Mark when boats from other fleets are about to round it, are rounding it, or have just rounded it. RRS 44.1 is changed to permit a boat to take the two-turns penalty when violating this Instruction. The last sentence of RRS 44.1 is not changed.

11. THE START.

- 11.1 Starts use the sequences printed on the front page of this booklet with the signals and timing shown. Except for boats in the first start, the Preparatory & Start signals for a start are, respectively, the Warning & Preparatory signals for boats in the next start. “.00” time on the front page corresponds to the time shown in the schedule of races. This changes RRS 26.
- 11.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an Orange Flag/shape on an RC boat and Mark L2, except that when Mark L1 is set, the start line for the Capri 25 fleet (only) shall be between the staff with Orange flag and Mark L1. A separate start mark may be set for Capri 25 also in trapezoid layouts. See Illustrations B & C. RRS 27.2 is changed to allow the RC to adjust the start line at any time.
- 11.3 The “round-an-end” rule described in RRS 30.1 shall be in effect for all starts. Code flag “I” will not be displayed. This changes RRS 30.1.
- 11.4 The Starting Zone: From the time the RC displays the line flag and until a boat’s preparatory signal, a boat shall not sail on port tack (or motor that direction) closer than 2 boat lengths to the stern of the RC boat—and shall keep clear of all boats in the starting zone that are *racing*. The starting zone is a rectangle formed by the starting line plus 300-foot extensions in each direction, then 300 feet back on the pre-start side from the ends of the extensions of the start line. Only the RC may protest under this instruction. This changes RRS 60.1
- 11.5 Until she has started and cleared the start line, a boat more than 2 minutes late to her start shall keep clear of all boats *racing* that are not more than 2 minutes late to a start.

- 11.6 **Individual Recalls:** when signaling an individual recall the RC may hail (and may announce via radio) the sail number(s) of boat(s) being recalled.
- 11.7 **General Recalls:** No sound signal will be made when lowering First Substitute after a General Recall. A class recalled shall go to the end of the start sequence and start 3 minutes after the last class (or previously recalled class) has started. This changes RRS 29.2.

12. CHANGE OF A COURSE.

- 12.1 When changing the direction of a leg of the course, the RC is permitted to repeatedly hail the compass bearing to the new mark instead of displaying a bearing or colored flags.
- 12.2 The RC may announce a change of course or the shortening of a course via hail, and may also announce changes on VHF Channel 68. Listen for hail of affected classes.
- 12.3 RRS 33(b) is deleted.
- 12.4. Instructions 12.1 through 12.3 change RRS 33.

13. CANCELLATION. Racing will be cancelled at the discretion of the RC for low/no wind, for wind gusts in excess of 26 knots, and/or as permitted by RRS 32.1.

14. THE FINISH.

- 14.1 The finish line will be between a staff displaying an Orange flag/shape on a RC Boat and a nearby mark. A windward finish may be at a windward mark or at a new mark set upwind of the windward mark. A windward mark is not a mark of the course when sailing to a finish line set upwind of a windward mark.
- 14.2 When finishes are to leeward and a gate is set, the finish will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a RC boat and the gate mark closest to the RC boat. The gate mark farthest from the RC boat is not a mark of the course when sailing to a leeward finish. This changes RRS 32.2.
- 14.3 A boat still racing (needing additional legs to complete her course) that is inadvertently or prematurely signaled as finishing shall continue to race and shall notify the RC *after finishing*.

15. TIME LIMIT. Burton Cup and Commodore Cup races have a 5-hour time limit. All other races have a 2½ hour time limit, except when the RC shortens to 2 hours per RRS 32. A boat not finishing within 45 minutes of the first boat in her class to finish, or within the time limit (whichever is later), or by sunset shall be scored DNF. The RC will use GPS time for sunset. This changes RRS 35, 89.3(a) and A5.

16. PROTESTS AND ARBITRATION.

16.1 Initial Requirements

- 16.1.1 A boat intending to protest another boat shall, after finishing, hail the RC boat the identity of the boat(s) being protested. This changes RRS 61, except 61.1(a)(3) is not changed. Wait to hail while the RC is busy finishing other boats. A hail by radio is not permitted or valid under this instruction. See Instruction 19.2.
- 16.1.2 Boats less than 6 meters LOA must display a red flag per RRS 61.2(a) when protesting. This changes RRS 61.1(a)(2).

16.1.3 The protest time limit is one hour after the RC boat docks after the last race of the day. Completed protest forms shall be placed in the protest box inside the WYC clubhouse or delivered to an arbitrator.

16.1.4 A protest is not valid when Instructions 16.1.1 through 16.1.3 are not followed and the Protest Committee will refuse to hear it under RRS 63.5.

16.2 **Arbitration**

16.2.1 Only alleged violations of RRS Part 2 Rules can be arbitrated. Representatives of involved boats shall jointly seek an arbitrator within the protest time limit after the race where the alleged incident occurred. A protesting boat shall bring the completed protest form. If representatives of involved boats do not timely seek an arbitrator, the issue will be referred to a protest hearing. No witnesses are permitted in arbitration hearings.

16.2.2 When an arbitrator is unable to decide an issue, or when the representatives of boats do not accept the arbitrator's ruling, the issue will be referred to a protest committee. Once concluded, an arbitration hearing shall not be reopened for any reason.

16.2.3 When an arbitrator's penalty ruling is accepted by the parties, a penalized boat shall receive a penalty of 2 points, or a 20% penalty as described in RRS 44.2(c), whichever is greater. Accepting a penalty in arbitration is voluntary and cannot be grounds for redress or be appealed.

16.3 **Protest Hearings**

16.3.1 Protests will be heard after the race (or cancelled race) on the Sunday following unsuccessful or non-attended arbitration (except regattas = same day, both hearings). Protest hearings may be re-scheduled by the PC or at a reasonable request from a party.

16.3.2 The time for a protest hearing will be posted on the Official Notice Board. The place for protest hearings will be the Protest Office (upstairs) at WYC.

16.3.3 A party to a protest hearing desiring to call witnesses shall assemble witnesses outside the protest office prior to the hearing. Witnesses not immediately present when called for testimony will not be heard.

17. **SCORING.**

17.1 As permitted by RRS A2, boats may exclude race score(s) from final series results according to the following table based on the number of races completed in the series.

17.2 The first sentence of RRS A4.2 is deleted. Regattas will be scored per Rule A9. For purposes of RRS A9 (only), the "number of boats entered" shall be the total number of boats of a class/division that came to at least one race of that series or regatta. This changes RRS A4.2 and A9.

17.3 A boat that comes to the starting area intending to race, but does not start, or starts but does not finish, may report the facts to her Fleet Captain by 6:00 PM the following day, else that

boat is scored DNC. Upon verification, the Fleet Captain shall correct the score by contacting the WYC Scorer following the procedure in the WYC policies.

18. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS - None.

19. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS.

- 19.1 The RC may make periodic hails before and during to racing on VHF Channel 68. The RC may hail premature starters (OCS) and may announce a change of course or a shortening of course on Channel 68.
- 19.2 Boats may monitor VHF Channel 68 before and during racing but shall not make any radio transmission (except for emergency) from the time the RC displays the line flag at the start and until all boats/all classes have finished racing. Protest notifications and other hails to the RC boat shall be made via boat-to-boat voice hails, never by radio.
- 19.3 A racing member of the RC may contact the signal boat via radio, but only to discuss wind/weather conditions related to course set-up, starting, postponing or canceling races.

20. PRIZES.

- 20.1 Prizes will be awarded for each series or cup race based on the average number of competitors in each fleet/division. One prize for 4 or fewer competitors, two for 5 or 6, three for 7-11, four for 12-15 or 5 for 16 or more average number of competitors.
- 20.2 Each boat that wins a prize, or that finishes any 25 races in the races/series listed in Instruction 20.4, plus the Big Island Series, Women's races, all J22 Fleet #1 Championship races and regattas, the U-Gotta regatta and the Capri 25 Championship regatta will be awarded a participation prize. Alternately, a participation prize will be awarded when a boat finishes the minimum number of counted races in the Championship Series or the Sunset Series.
- 20.3 Prizes for Heavy Air Cup races may be awarded at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 20.4 The Boat of The Year Trophy is awarded to the boat with the most B-O-Y points for 1st place finishes in the following Series and Cup races: A-B-C-G-T-M-ADA & Fall Regattas, plus Burton-Commodore-Frostbite. B-O-Y points are awarded to first place finishers in each qualified race, as follows: 4 points for fleet participation of 10 or more boats in the race; 3.9 points for 9 boats; 3.7 points for 8 boats; 3 points for 6-7 boats; 2.5 points for 5 boats; 1.9 points for 4 boats; 1.2 points for 3 boats; 0.4 points for 2 boats; zero points for 1 boat.

Special Sailing Instruction “A”

Foul Language is prohibited during WYC Races. Any boat emitting Foul Language loud enough to be heard by another person, regardless at whom the Foul Language was directed, shall be subject to protest, a special arbitration hearing and possible penalties. Any boat may protest another boat from which it heard foul language. On the first offense in arbitration, the penalty is a WARNING except when the incident is considered by the arbitrator to be egregious. Egregious incidences may be immediately referred to the full protest committee for a hearing under RRS #2 or #69 with all penalties available. Upon a second offense an arbitrator may rule a 20% penalty (minimum of a 2 places). If a second incident is deemed serious, the arbitrator may rule a DSQ. If the penalized boat does not accept the Arbitrator’s ruling, the incident shall be referred to the Protest Committee for a hearing. An egregious incident, or subsequent incidents by the same boat, will be subject to immediate referral to the Protest Committee without arbitration. Repeated incidents may be judged to be a gross breach of good manners and sportsmanship under RRS 69. When a boat declines to attend the arbitration hearing, the incident shall be referred to the Protest Committee. A protest for foul language shall cite this Sailing Instruction (Special SI “A”) as the alleged rule infringed on the Protest Form. When an incident is referred to the Protest Committee, the protestor shall change the rule infringed to read RRS #2.

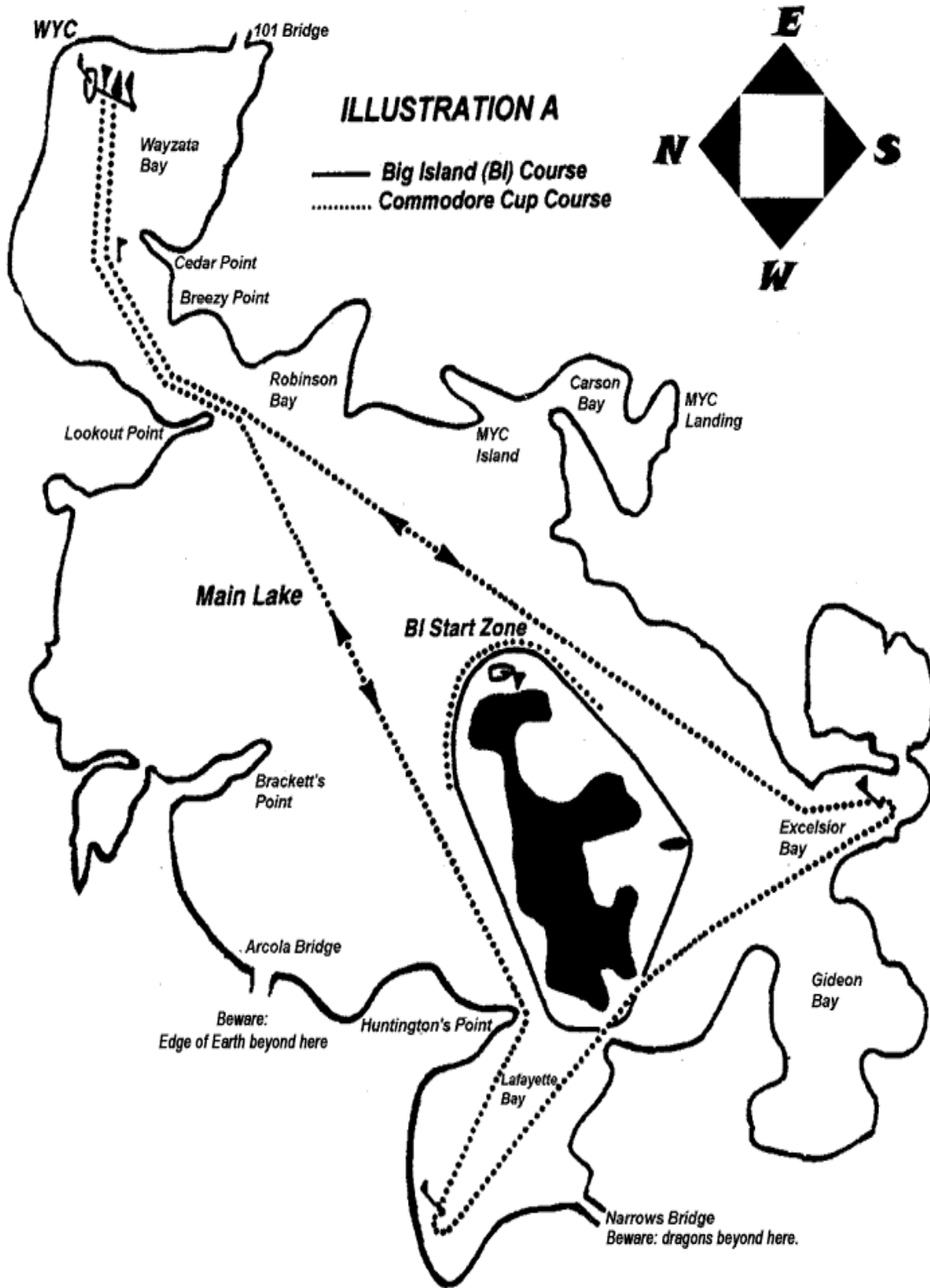
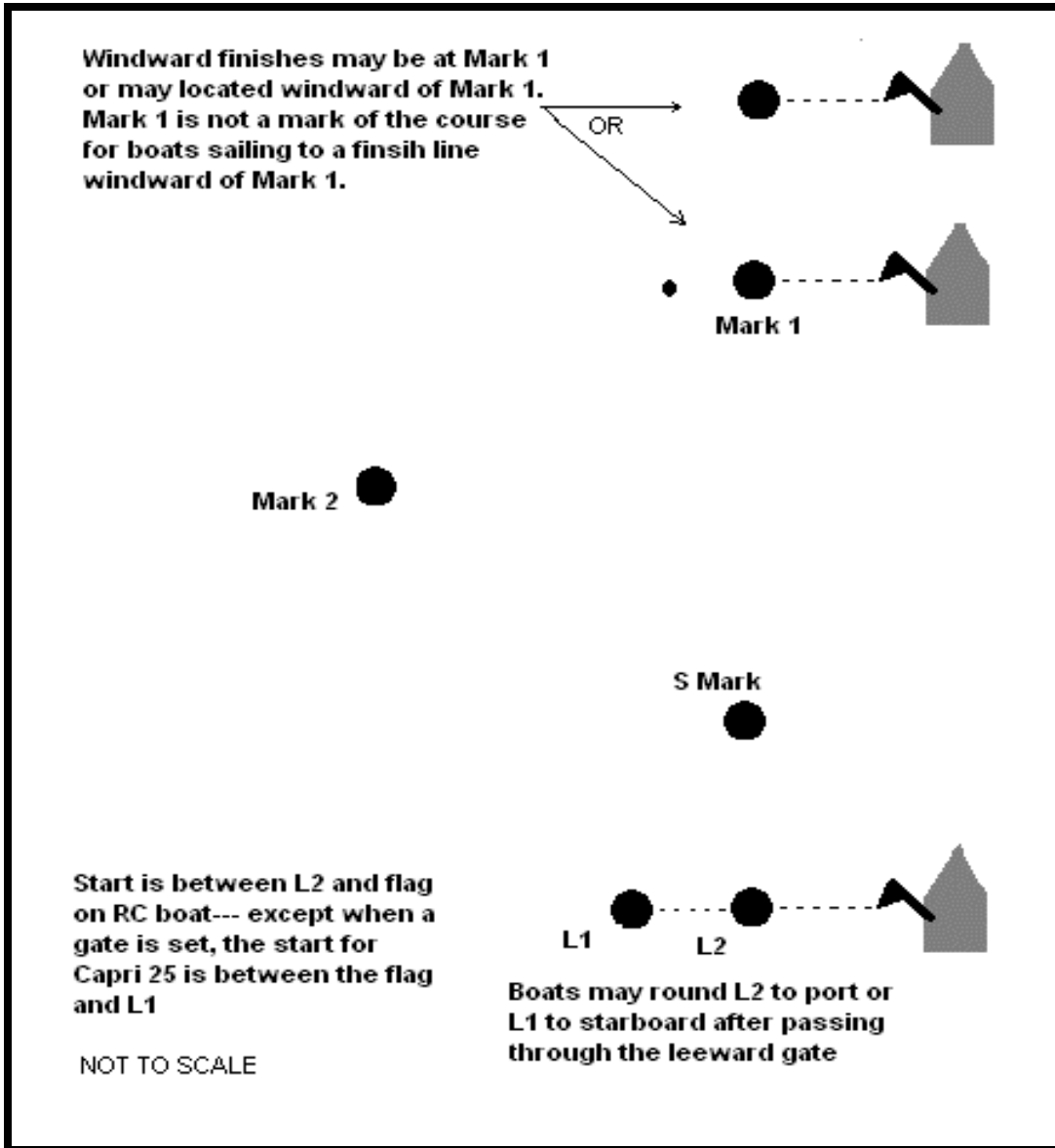
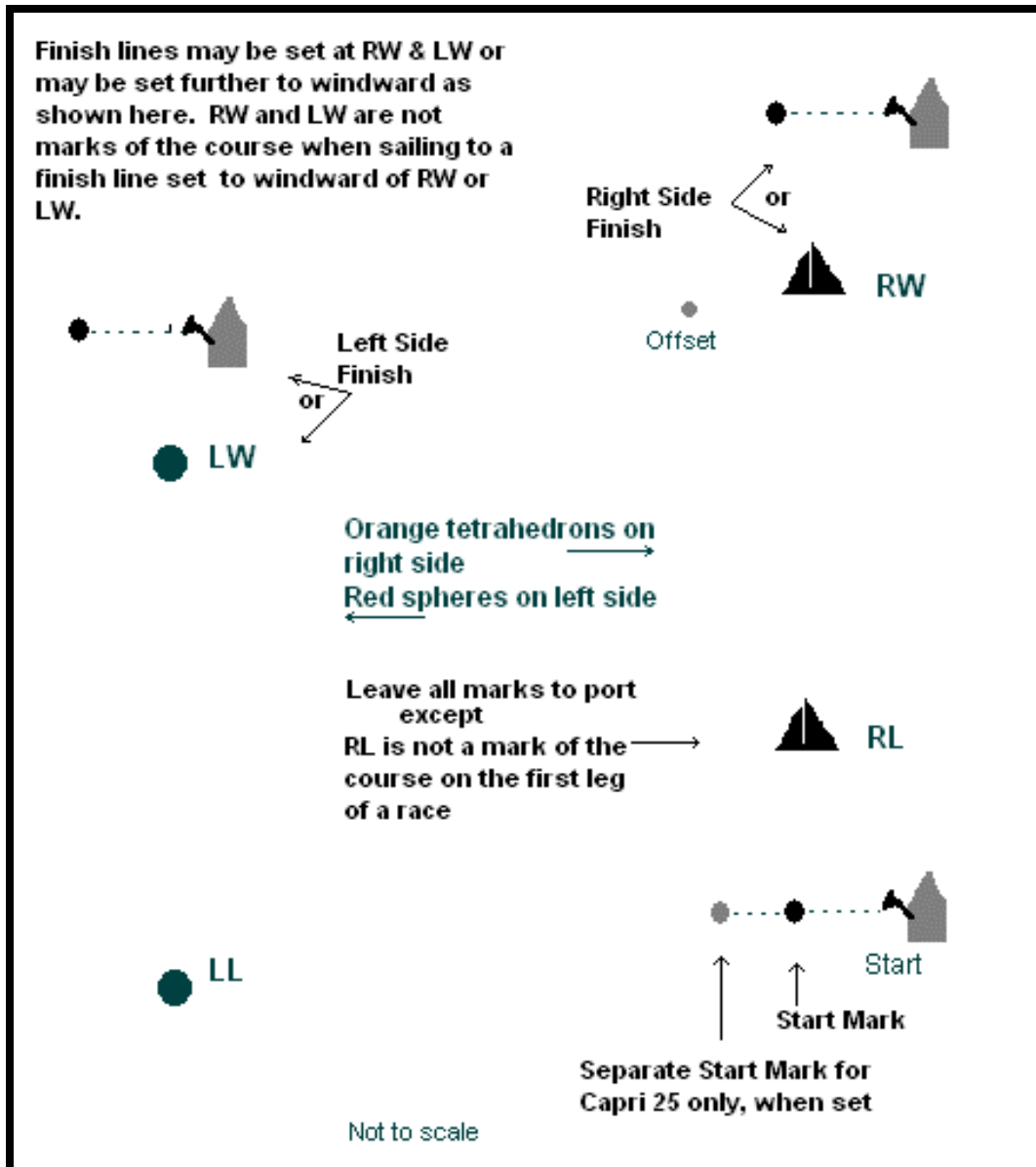

WYC RACING POLICIES

Not Part of the Sailing Instructions

1) Establish Your Finish Position

Note (and if possible write down) the time when you finish, either actual time or your elapsed time. Notice other boats around you at the finish, boats in your own class, boats in other classes, both ahead and behind your boat. It is particularly helpful to note a timed fleet boat near you to later be able to establish your time of finish

The WYC Race Committee does an outstanding job. They audio record the finishes and the times. Yet when well over 100 boats participate in WYC races, the RC may miss recording your finish. When you note your finish position and time, and other boats nearby, you may be able to help fix a position for your boat, if missed. Back at the club you and the RC can listen to the tape to help accurately establish your finish if it was missed. Or, when asked, you may be able to help establish the position and/or time for another boat, whether in your class or a different class.

2) What To Do If You Are Not Scored Or Are Scored Incorrectly

After the race, the PRO will post the “Raw” score sheets and “Update” the club computer ASAP. If you are not scored correctly, the data you kept at the finish as suggested above will help. Immediately after the race you may contact the PRO or the Club Race Officer/Scorer (Blake Middleton) at the clubhouse to discuss the possible error and the correction may be able to be made on the spot. However, later if you discover an error, you are asked to ONLY contact your fleet captain and convey whatever information you have. Your Fleet Captain will contact the Club Race Officer/Scorer (Blake Middleton) in an effort to correct the results. You are asked NOT to contact the Club Race Officer/Scorer at this time. It is best if you email your Fleet Captain. If not by Email, ensure in writing or otherwise that the Fleet Captain understands the error and knows exactly what to report. The Fleet Captain will contact the scorer by Email (only) at MYC@aol.com with a subject line that reads “WYC Scoring Error.” If you email your Fleet Captain, your Email can be forwarded, with comments as necessary. **FLEET CAPTAINS TAKE NOTE.**

3) You Have 2 Weeks at Series End to Make Corrections

Scoring changes cannot go on forever. The policy is that two weeks after the last race of a series or cup race the scoring is final. You have two weeks to get corrections done. You can go on record before the two-week period ends, even if your fleet captain is out of town. You can do this by email, US mail, voice mail or phone calls to your fleet captain. Members can check and verify race results at the computer at WYC or on-line at www.wyc.org.

4) The 6 Race Requirement

The WYC by-laws state a family member who Finish 6 races/season in their boat maintains a mooring priority in the highest category—which is based primarily on membership seniority. If you finish the six races in a year and are in the marina that year, you are guaranteed a dock or buoy in WYC marina the following year, assuming you pay your fees timely and the water is deep enough.

5) The 15 Race Requirement

The WYC by-laws state that the Board of Directors shall determine fees. The WYC BOD has established a two-tier mooring fee system; one system is for members who meet the 15 Race Requirement and the other is for members who do not. This allows the club to charge the higher “commercial market rate for docking on Lake Minnetonka” for mooring members who do not race at all, powerboats, or sailboat who are not active racers, while charging a lower “WYC Racer Mooring Rate” for active racers (those meeting the 15 race requirement). New members to the WYC who declare their intent to be active racers (at least 15 races) are automatically granted the racer mooring rate the first year mooring.

6) What Races Count toward the 15 Race Requirement

All WYC keelboat races on Lake Minnetonka shown on WYC Current Season’s Racing Schedule may be counted toward the 15-race requirement. This includes all regular keelboat races for all classes plus but not limited to the regattas like Cool Cup, U-Gotta Regatta, J-22 Districts, and J-22 Fleet #1 Championship run by both the WYC and MYC Races committees and other races shown from time to time on the WYC Schedule for keelboats on Lake Minnetonka. You must sail your boat.

7) How To Receive Credit Against the 15 Race requirement For Cancelled, Abandoned, Did Not Finish, Etc.

The new WYC computer scoring system has a provision for scoring a competitor “ATT”, meaning “ATTENDED” when the race is Cancelled, Abandoned, or a racer receives a DNF (did not finish), or any of the other scoring abbreviations noted in A11 of the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) except, DNC (did not come to the starting area). When races are cancelled or abandoned, the Race Committee will make an effort to stand by the race course and the committee boat dock to take sail numbers of competitors who pass by so they can immediately enter them into the WYC scoring computer as a “ATT” which gives the boat credit for that race even though there was no race.

8) Substituting Certain Activities For Up to 3 of the 15 Race Requirement

Members must participate in at least 12 of the keelboat races scheduled in the WYC Schedule of Races. Members may substitute for up to 3 of the 15-race requirement by participating in associated club support activities. These include:

- a) Provide a boat for the “WYC On the Water Training” to be a Host Skipper. Three Saturdays equals the maximum 3 activities credits. Receive a WYC Host Skipper Hat for participating in 2 of the 3 Saturdays.
- b) Be a Certified Guest Instructor for “WYC On the Water Training. Three Saturdays equals the maximum 3 activities credits. Receive a Prized Red WYC Guest Instructor Hat for 2 of the 3 Saturdays.
- c) Participate in “Spring Cleanup Day”
- d) Participate in another WYC event approved in advanced by the WYC BOD as recorded in the minutes.

Organizers of the above events will keep list of those qualifying for participation credit and enter the data into the WYC computer for the member’s credit. It would be a good idea for members to check the WYC scoring computer at the clubhouse or on the web to see that they were properly credited.

9) Trophies

WYC Sailing Instruction 20.1 says that number of trophies per Fleet for a Series (or Cup Race) will be based on the overall average number of competitors in that event. An example: a 6 race series where the number of competitors in the races were 6-2-5-4-10-8 = 35. 35 divided by 6 = 5.83 is rounded to 6. In this example, there would be two trophies (1st & 2nd) for six participants in that Fleet. If races 5 & 6 were canceled in that example, there would be just one trophy for that Series based on an average of 4.25 competitors.

There has been confusion in the past on how trophy averages are calculated because of language in Sailing Instruction 17.2. 17.2 does not apply to trophies. Instruction 17.2 refers specifically and only to Rule A9 to distinguish the number of points assigned to a boat that Did Not Come (“DNC”) to a race vs. points for those boats that did come---including DSQs, DNFs, DNSs, etc.

10) Appealing an Unsatisfactory Scoring with a “Request For Redress”

If a competitor is dissatisfied with a scoring result they may file a request for redress in accordance with the RRS.

11) Appealing to the WYC Board Of Directors the Missing of the 15 Race Requirement

A member who misses the 15-race requirement due to mitigating or extraordinary circumstances may appeal to the WYC BOD at season’s end.

- a) When filed under mitigating circumstances the following applies:
 - i) Mitigating circumstances can be a change in employment or special family circumstances, which temporarily hinder the member’s ability to participate in racing.
 - ii) The BOD may rule that the member must pay the market rate for the forthcoming season, but upon meeting the 15-race requirement, receive a refund for the difference in rate.
 - iii) This exception will not be granted for 2 consecutive seasons.
- b) When filed under extraordinary circumstances the following applies:
 - i) Extraordinary circumstances can be: prolonged illness or death, severe accident, or natural disaster, or severe boat damage, which precludes participation in races for an extended period of time.
 - ii) The BOD may grant an outright exception to the 15-race requirement and permit the member to pay the “Racing Rate” for the forthcoming season.
- c) Appeals, which do not fall within the above guidelines/definitions, will be denied.

Answering Pennant – Postponement Signal

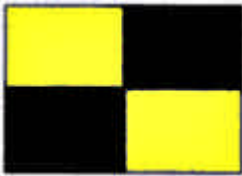
- a) When given ashore, no race will be started before 45 minutes after the flag is lowered. 2 sound signals when raised, one sound signal when lowered.
- b) When given on the water, races not started are postponed. Warning signal will be made after AP is lowered. Sounds signals as above.

RED/WHITE



- C** A mark of the course has been moved. An accompanying **Green** flag says the new mark is right of the original mark's position, an accompanying **Red** flag says the new mark is left of the original mark's position. Repetitive sound signals.

- L** a) When displayed ashore: a notice to competitors has been posted on the notice board. No sounds ashore, nor on the water.
b) When display on the water: "Come within hail" or "Follow me."

- N OVER A** Abandonment signal. "All races are abandoned for the day."
3 sound signals.

BLUE/WHITE over WHITE/BLUE



- AP over C** All scheduled races are cancelled. A special "Heavy Air Cup" race will be held. All boats start together. Boats must be registered with the PRO a minimum of six days prior to participation. 3 sound signals.

RED/WHITE over BLUE/WHITE/RED/WHITE/BLUE



S Shorten Course:

- a) Before start sequence: "Time limit has been shortened to 2 hours, shorter legs." 2 sound signals before initial warning signal.
- b) During race: "At least one Class has its course shortened to finish between RC boat and mark of the course." Repeated hails.

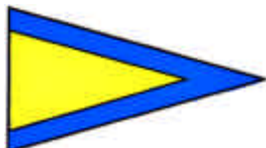

X Individual Recall:

Broken out immediately after the start signal and accompanied by one sound signal. The Race Committee may attempt to hail each boat being recalled. Flag is displayed until all boats are on the pre-start side of the line, or for 2 minutes, whichever is earlier.

FIRST SUBSTITUTE – GENERAL RECALL: The class is recalled for a new start. The class recalled will go to the end of the starting order and start 3 minutes after the last class has started. 2 sound signals. The signal will be lowered one minute before the start of the next class.
